A message from Pastor Eric Sayler

I love to bake and cook when I have time. One of the meals my kids regularly ask for is waffles.

Now, the waffles I make aren't from a mix, I make them from scratch.

They're light and fluffy, with a hint of cinnamon, vanilla, and apple.

One of the keys to making these waffles so tasty is the way the eggs are handled.

I don't just crack the eggs and dump them in the mix, I separate them. Whites go in a little bowl and the yokes go in with the rest of the ingredients.

The last thing I do, just before pouring the batter onto the iron, is whisk the whites till they are stiff. Then I plop them into the other already combined ingredients and mix them in until they are spread evenly throughout and no clumps remain. No more, not less.

This process changes the consistency from a dense waffle to a lighter feel that is much more pleasant.

This separation really helps the final product.

Separation isn't always a good thing, however. There are a number of examples in scripture when people felt separated from God's love.

In his letter to the Roman believers Paul addresses this concern that the church members there had encountered: was there anything that could separate them from God's love? Is anything big enough to interrupt His compassion for us? It seems they were experiencing persecution, trouble, and resistance to their choice to be Christians. Does this mean God had abandoned them?

This Sabbath we will finish our "Blessed Be" series on the Beatitudes with a study on "The Persecuted." What does Jesus say about those who suffer persecution? Can everyone who encounters hardship claim persecution?


