Welcome to Eastgate SDA Church! A message from Intern Pastor Rachelle Santee-Martling

When I was four years old, we had a glass fireplace in our living room. I would look at the glowing colors of the fire and desire to touch the flames. My parents had specifically told me not to touch the fireplace even after it was off because it was still hot.

One day, the fireplace had been recently turned off and I lightly touched the hot glass with my wrist. I quickly took it off as I felt the pain of my skin melting. I was ashamed and tried to hide the burn on my wrist. But I could not hide what I had done from my parents. My parents lovingly bandaged my wound and told me that I would probably have a nasty scar where I had gotten burned.

When I was little there were some things I never wanted, and an ugly scar was one of those things. I prayed to God, knowing I had disobeyed my parents and acknowledging that the burn was my fault. I still prayed that I would not have a big ugly scar.

God had mercy and heard my prayers. I couldn't tell after it healed that I had been burned. I never touched the fireplace again and never forgot the lessons I had learned, the greatest lesson being that God hears our prayers our most unworthy moments.

In Daniel 9, Daniel prays to God seeking mercy for him and his people. He acknowledges that they don't deserve God's deliverance. The Israelites are completely unworthy of God answering their cry. Daniel bases his whole prayer on God's character of mercy.

Join us on Sabbath as we look closer at Daniel's prayer for deliverance and how God's character is revealed.



<u>Local Church Budget ~ Time is short.</u> "May the Lord give no rest, day nor night, to those who are now careless and indolent in the cause and work of God. The end is near. This is that which Jesus would have us keep ever before us — the shortness of time." These solemn words were uttered by Ellen G. White in a letter written in 1886 (Letter 97, 1886). She definitely believed that urgency was needed when the people of God were asked to partake in the spreading of the Gospel.

Much like today, the people of her time were preoccupied with mundane tasks and with "making a living." There is nothing wrong with making a living. Yet, the Scriptures warn us that priorities need to be kept in their proper perspective. The apostle Matthew is very frank when he draws a parallel between the time of Noah and the time of the end (Matthew 24:38). The Bible describes the last generation as succumbing to worldly cares and God becoming a lesser priority.

Is this really what we want? Would 80 years on this planet be it? Jesus promised an eternity with God. Why would we be careless and trade infinity for a temporary life?

Communion Bread for Friday, September 11 ~ time to be announced

We are planning a digital communion service for this Friday, September 11. More details will be issued once the Pastor has returned from vacation. In the meantime, below you will find recipes to choose from as you prepare the communion bread. You may also pick up some good grape juice for your home service. We invite you to gather family or friends and share this time together.

COMMUNION BREAD (1/2 recipe) ~ for small families or small groups

Here is an easy recipe for communion bread:

1 cups whole wheat pastry flour

1/2 tsp salt

1/4 cup canola oil (or other vegetable oil)

- 1 Tablespoon + 2 teaspoons cup water
- 1. You start with a gallon size Ziploc bag. Put in water, oil, & salt. Seal and mix until all ingredients are mixed and salt is dissolved.
- 2. Add flour and knead until thoroughly mixed. Set aside for 15-20 minutes
- 3. Use rolling pin and roll until dough fills the whole bag (flat)
- 4. Cut one side and bottom of bag and open the top. Fold back to expose dough (still on the bag)
- 5. Transfer to baking pan covered with parchment paper
- 6. Cut into 1" squares, poke 3 holes using a fork, in each square
- 7. Bake at 425° for 10 to 12 minutes
- 8. Cool on pan

COMMUNION BREAD (Full Recipe as seen in the video) ~ for larger families

Here is an easy recipe for communion bread:

2 cups whole wheat pastry flour

1 tsp salt

1/2 cup canola oil (or other vegetable oil)

1/3 cup water

- 1. You start with a gallon size Ziploc bag. Put in water, oil, & salt. Seal and mix until all ingredients are mixed and salt is dissolved.
- 2. Add flour and knead until thoroughly mixed. Set aside for 15-20 minutes
- 3. Use rolling pin and roll until dough fills the whole bag (flat)
- 4. Cut one side and bottom of bag and open the top. Fold back to expose dough (still on the bag)
- 5. Transfer to baking pan covered with parchment paper
- 6. Cut into 1" squares, poke 3 holes using a fork, in each square
- 7. Bake at 425° for 12 minutes
- 8. Cool on pan


