



Women's Ministry ~ the Sisters Corner Words specifically for the hearts of women

Fall is in the air and it's time to break out those hearty soup recipes! Jeremy Dixon's Revive Café Cookbook series depict scrumptious, tantalizing bowls of yumminess. Most the time they turn out like the picture. I must confess I read the Bible and recipes very differently. The Bible is God's instructions to me, a recipe, now that's just a guide, a list of suggestions. Below I've listed the recipe as Jeremy wrote it with my adaptations in italics. I like thick soup, I don't like cleaning appliances, and I want leftovers for my freezer and to share. Jeremy could have called this Indian Seasoned Lentil Soup, but Spiced flows better. It's not spicy hot, unless you use a hot curry powder. No matter what Jeremy named it, I call it YUMMY!

Indian Spiced Lentil Soup

Makes 8 - 1 cup servings (16 servings – Freezes and shares well.)

1 large chopped onion (2 onions)

2 cloves garlic chopped or crushed

(1 Tablespoon pre-chopped)

2 tablespoons oil (1 cup vegetable broth)

1 teaspoon cumin (1 Tablespoon)

1 teaspoon turmeric (1 Tablespoon)

1 teaspoon mild curry powder

(2 Tablespoons)

1 stalk celery roughly chopped

(3 stalks diced)

1 large carrot roughly chopped

(3 carrots diced)

12 oz can crushed tomatoes (24-oz can)

1 cup red lentils (4 cups)

6 cups hot water (cover lentils plus a little)

1 cup cashew nuts + 1 cup cold water

(2 cans coconut milk)

1 teaspoon salt (1.5 teaspoons salt)

4 tablespoons date puree or honey (*omitted*)

Ensure salt is added at end, not earlier, as it will inhibit the lentils cooking properly.

- 1. Sauté onion, garlic and oil (vegetable broth) until clear.
- 2. Stir in spices and vegetables.
- 3. Add lentils, tomatoes, and water and bring to boil. Simmer for around 30 minutes or until lentils and vegetables are cooked. (Cooked in Instant Pot for 18 minutes, water was about 1 inch above lentils, but below "max" line).
- 4. Blend with stick blender. (Omitted because I diced celery and carrots).
- 5. Separately blended cashew nuts and cold water to make a thick cream. (My blender is hard to clean, used two cans coconut milk instead). Add to the pot.
- 6. Add salt and date puree/honey (omitted sweetener) and taste.

God created an abundance of diverse food and seasoning combinations. Try some new ones, share with a friend, and enjoy a virtual meal together! Who says you have to eat alone, with just your family, or clean house to have "company"? Be adventurous and adapt the rules. Genesis 1:29 And God said, "Look! I have given you the seed-bearing plants throughout the earth and all the fruit trees for your food." ~Stephenie Renshaw




