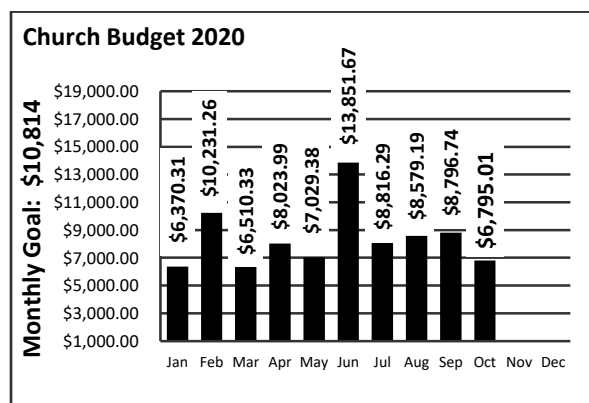

It was a dark and moonless night as we snaked our way through the abandoned streets. I squinted through the windshield as a light rain began to fall. It was getting late, but as always, our ritual was to go to the fire station and get kisses from daddy before going to bed. I wouldn't hear the end of it if I didn't, and gladly took the time. The worst part though was leaving.

As we approached our house a knot of tension filled my stomach. I hated coming home to a dark and deserted house *alone*. My senses were always on hyper drive, and every little sound would send shivers running down my spine. As was my habit, I called to tell my husband that we had arrived safely home. He would then stay on the phone until I dutifully combed the house with a baseball bat. Actually, it was my son's plastic t-ball bat, but it would at least leave a mark. I knew I would be no match for an intruder, but maybe I could buy myself enough time to run back out to my locked car where my babies were, and it would also give me time to shout for help.

On this night however, my husband had a 911 call he was responding to, and didn't answer when I called. I laughed at myself for being nervous. Whenever he was home we marched in as one big happy family, what was the big deal? It was a bit chilly outside, and the kiddos were still

awake. I figured it would be better to get them inside as quickly as possible. I hurried them into the house and after brushing teeth and reading “just one more story” for the **6th** time, I finally got our oldest settled down. Our younger two however would have nothing to do with staying in bed *unless* I lay down with them. As I rocked them, I heard a faint noise in the hallway, I froze, remembering that the Sherriff had warned us that there had been a series of thefts recently in our neighborhood and to be extra careful of prowlers that had been seen sneaking through many of our neighbors’ yards. My heart began to pound and fear gurgled in my throat. After what seemed like ages with no more noises, I rationalized that it must have been our dog padding along, after all, she was always wandering the house throughout the night. Still, my anxiety lingered. Another hour slowly ticked by with much tossing and turning before I was finally able to slip out of the girls’ bedroom into the dark hallway.

The only light in the house was coming from a nightlight in my bedroom. Sleep fogged my brain as I stumbled into the bathroom to get ready for bed. As I bent down to take off a sock I tripped over ... a ... a ... I was instantly awake as I stared down at the floor, and the hair on the back of my neck stood up. I could barely make out the outline of a pair of shoes. *Fear shot through me.* As I slowly stood up I saw my silhouette reflecting in the dark mirror, and right next to me ... another head was also rising!!!! Terror seized me as I clawed at the trespasser with all the strength I could muster, but he easily swayed out of my reach. Suddenly he had one of my hands wrapped in twine and I knew it would be only seconds before I would be disabled.

“NO!!!!” my brain screamed, “NOOOOOOO!” My sweet kids still sleeping in their beds depended on *me* to keep them safe! I WOULD NOT GIVE UP WITHOUT A BETTER FIGHT!!!!!!

“Dear God, please help us!” I backed up quickly and made another final kick at my attacker as I quickly turned on the light with my free hand I blinked hard in the bright light staring at the floor. There lay my assailant at my feet. With one mighty blow, I had conquered a ... a balloon? Yes. Earlier in the day, my sweet children had anchored the balloon to a pair of my shoes without me realizing it. I had released “him” when I tripped over them. “He” slowly rose as I did, but didn’t have enough helium to stay up. My mad ninja skills did him in and had twisted his ribbon around me hand. My sweet children did me in with a balloon. My heart though, was full of gratitude to a mighty God that continues to answer prayers.

Psalm 27 David says: “The LORD is my light and my salvation -- whom shall I fear? **The LORD is the stronghold** of my life -- of whom shall I be afraid? 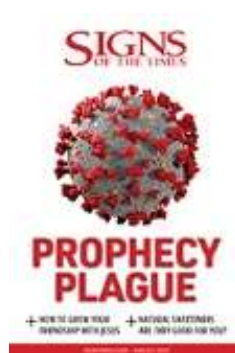

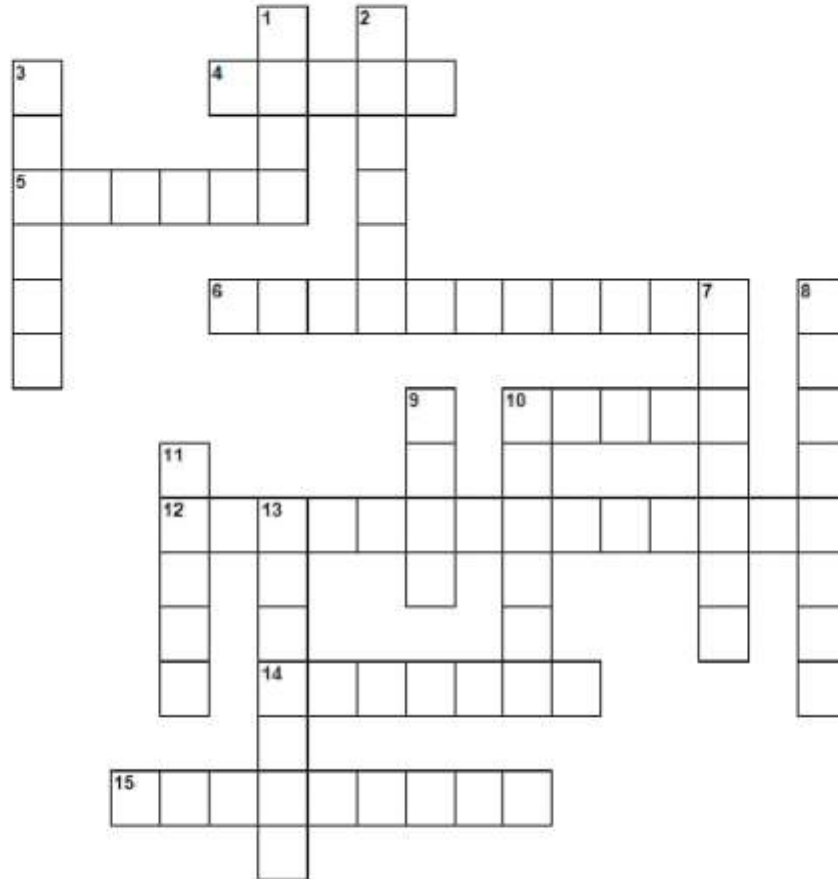
