


Community Service "Food Baskets" for - Thanksgiving

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. Galatians 5:22-23

Should we stay or should we go? Am I being self-centered or love-centered? When I pray for God's wisdom, is that because I don't like the advice I'm receiving and I hope He will tell me something different? Keeping the financial health of our church in mind - Giving Plan

How your local church budget fits into "My Personal Giving Plan"

Like every family, the local church family has financial obligations to meet. Some are easy to see like power and heat, but many are not so obvious: children's magazines, Sabbath School Bible study guides, teaching supplies, staff salaries, cleaning services, church school operating expenses, property insurance, worthy student fund, and community outreach. These are but a few of the costs that must be met month after month as the local church seeks to be a light in the community. Because these expenses are constant, My Personal Giving Plan recommends that 3-5 percent of one's income be set aside for the local church budget. This systematic giving ensures that all share both in the blessings and the responsibilities of the local congregation.

The North American Division encourages the use of the "My Personal Giving Plan." This plan was developed as a guideline to assist members in systematic giving. The plan suggests that, in addition to returning 10 percent of a member's personal income as tithe, certain percentages may be dedicated as offerings to three main categories:

- Local Church Budget: 3-5 percent
- Conference Advance: 1-2 percent

(Education, evangelism, VBS, summer camps, and union magazines)

• World Budget: 1-3 percent

The My Personal Giving Plan encourages each of us to renew our commitment to the principles of Christian stewardship. While it blesses the church as a whole, its real impact is on us as individuals in our faith-based covenant with God.

Everything in God's creation is orderly and purposeful. The same can be said of My Personal Giving Plan. Like all plans, it requires thought and consideration. No great work can be built upon emotional or sporadic giving.

Local Church:

A Review of what the Maintenance Reserve Fund has done here at Eastgate this year

This year we have accomplished a few building maintenance items which required your financial assistance but were not always things as obvious as new flooring or room lighting.

Our Garage had been broken into several times and some doors were damaged and no longer secure. So, repairs were made to our large roll up door, a new entry door was installed (steel with a steel frame) and a new roll up door was installed where we store our lawn mower. The combination of these has increased our security for that area of our church property.

Improvements were made to our irrigation system. Dwight Bartlett took on his first building project and constructed a shed over our irrigation pump area. It has been a blessing in keeping things (debris) out of the intake location of our water system and has improved reliability. Thank you Dwight for your time.

Campus Lighting, Exterior: Our own Casey Werner & Trent Fowler, owners of Power Solutions, replaced the entry lights on the North and South sides of the Narthex Entries. We now

have low energy consuming, reliable lighting for our after dark events when entering the building. This has also been an improvement to our building security.

The Women's Restroom: This is an area where a combination of budgeted funds and private donations of both time and money were able to result in a completely new look for this area of our church. New wall colors, new improved lighting, child diaper changing station and decorations have all created a beautiful little space. Someday we hope to replace the flooring, both carpet and linoleum. We again would like to express our appreciation to those individuals who helped along the way. April McCorkle, Barbara & Josie Henderson, Carol Hargreaves, Michelle Einig and Doug & Sherry Hamilton all contributed in different special ways.

Replaced All Bathroom Faucets to ADA Standards: Because of a private donation we were able to replace all of the old bathroom faucets. Thank you donor!

Fellowship Hall HVAC: Currently we are in a selection process to replace the heating and cooling system for the fellowship hall. After nearly 35 - 40 years the old system has failed. Our Facilities Committee will be finalizing the selection of both contractor and replacement equipment in a few days.

Future Plans: When we set a goal in our January Business Meeting of \$14,000 to be raised this year for building maintenance we were optimistic. Then COVID happened and some job losses occurred along with other effects on our church lives. The result has been that to date, approximately \$2,604.87 is what has been received toward the goal. What kinds of things have been left not yet completed?

Parking Lot Lighting Upgrades: It is our goal to improve the energy efficiency of our parking lot lights by converting them to LED lights. These would cost less to operate and would soon pay for the cost of the up-grade. Along the way, several lights have bulbs that have failed and need to be replaced; these would be dealt with in the change out.

Classroom Lighting: In the future we would benefit by up-grading current light fixtures to LED fixtures. This would again reduce energy consumption and the reward would be reduced energy bills. There will soon be a specific proposal for the Sanctuary Lighting.

HVAC up-grades: We have at least five units that are currently supplying heating and cooling to our building spaces that are in the 35-40 year old category. The replacement of these units will give us the most return on our energy savings. However, each unit is expensive; the average cost will be \$10,000 per unit. A replacement proposal will be included in a five year plan to be revealed at our next Church Business Meeting in January 9, 2021.

So, we wanted you to know that your contributions have been appreciated. We have spent over \$4,000 and we will continue to faithfully care for this facility that we have been blessed with. We care for it so that it can be used to further the ministry of Jesus Christ here in the Walla Walla Valley.


