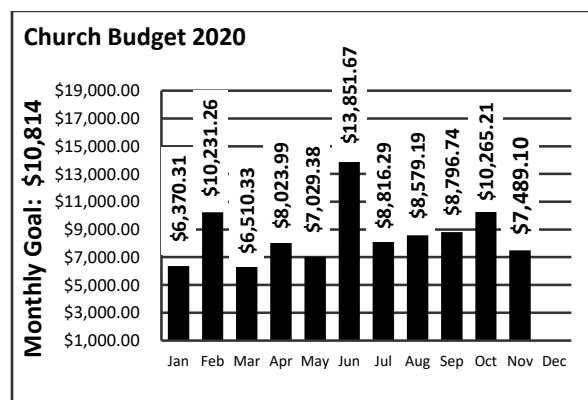

Like-minded People. Each summer Camp MiVoden is inhabited by a new group of young adults with a common goal of connecting young campers to Christ. This young taskforce comes from different schools, different family experiences and sometimes even different countries. Yet they give their God-given energies and talents to helping campers experience Jesus in creative ways that they haven't experienced before.

1/3 of your gifts given through today's offering will enable Camp MiVoden to continue training, encouraging and mentoring youth and young adults to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Is Adventist Education Important to our Church? A study conducted in the Southern Union Conference of the North American Division analyzed 844 children and youth from Adventist families in 1990. More than 40% of those who had no Adventist education were never baptized. That percentage dropped to only 15.4% for those who had one or more years of Adventist education. If an individual had 11 or more years of Adventist education only 3.1% never chose to be baptized. Obviously, Adventist education is evangelism and makes an eternal difference. Consider the cost of Adventist education an investment in the kingdom of heaven.

2/3 of today's offering benefits the Kids Educational Endowment Program.

Operation Christmas Child Shoe Boxes

Rachel Boram reports that as a church we were able to supply 85 Christmas packages for the children of the world. Rachel will tell us a little more about the culmination of this project this Sabbath during our Community Life announcements.

Waiting on God is tough! We pray over things, we claim His promises from the word and then are often tested for what seems beyond our limits. But God hears; "And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him." John 5:15.

It's the waiting that gets to us.....

"Wait on the Lord; Be of good courage, and He shall strengthen your heart." Psalm 27:14.

Here's the deal; God would LOVE to answer our prayers immediately, giving us the desires of our hearts. Every parent wants to do that for their beloved child. But, what good is a spoiled child?

If not for the waiting on God in my life through all the tough, tough trials and struggles I would not KNOW my heavenly Father as I do today, nor would I be the person I am now. My heart has truly been strengthened. I understand more fully what Faith, Trust, Patience, Love, Goodness, and Mercy are.

The saddest thing of all is to watch someone turn their heart against God in the time of waiting. Out of impatience, hurt and anger, they close the door to what God's plan may have been for them. It is my prayer that you find peace in Him today God has great things in store for you, and He will bring them to pass in His perfect timing.

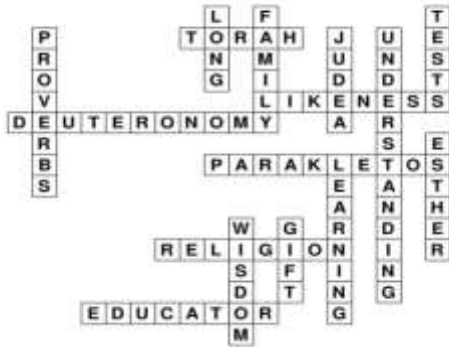

Keeping the financial health of our church in mind - Giving Plan

How your local church budget fits into "My Personal Giving Plan"

Like every family, the local church family has financial obligations to meet. Some are easy to see like power and heat, but many are not so obvious: children's magazines, Sabbath School Bible study guides, teaching supplies, staff salaries, cleaning services, church school operating expenses, property insurance, worthy student fund, and community outreach. These are but a few of the costs that must be met month after month as the local church seeks to be a light in the community. Because these expenses are constant, My Personal Giving Plan recommends that 3-5 percent of one's income be set aside for the local church budget. This

systematic giving ensures that all share both in the blessings and the responsibilities of the local congregation.

The North American Division encourages the use of the “My Personal Giving Plan.” This plan was developed as a guideline to assist members in systematic giving. The plan suggests that, in addition to returning 10 percent of a member’s personal income as tithe, certain percentages may be dedicated as offerings to three main categories:

- Local Church Budget: 3-5 percent
- Conference Advance: 1-2 percent
(Education, evangelism, VBS, summer camps, and union magazines)
- World Budget: 1-3 percent

The My Personal Giving Plan encourages each of us to renew our commitment to the principles of Christian stewardship. While it blesses the church as a whole, its real impact is on us as individuals in our faith-based covenant with God.

Everything in God’s creation is orderly and purposeful. The same can be said of My Personal Giving Plan. Like all plans, it requires thought and consideration. No great work can be built upon emotional or sporadic giving.

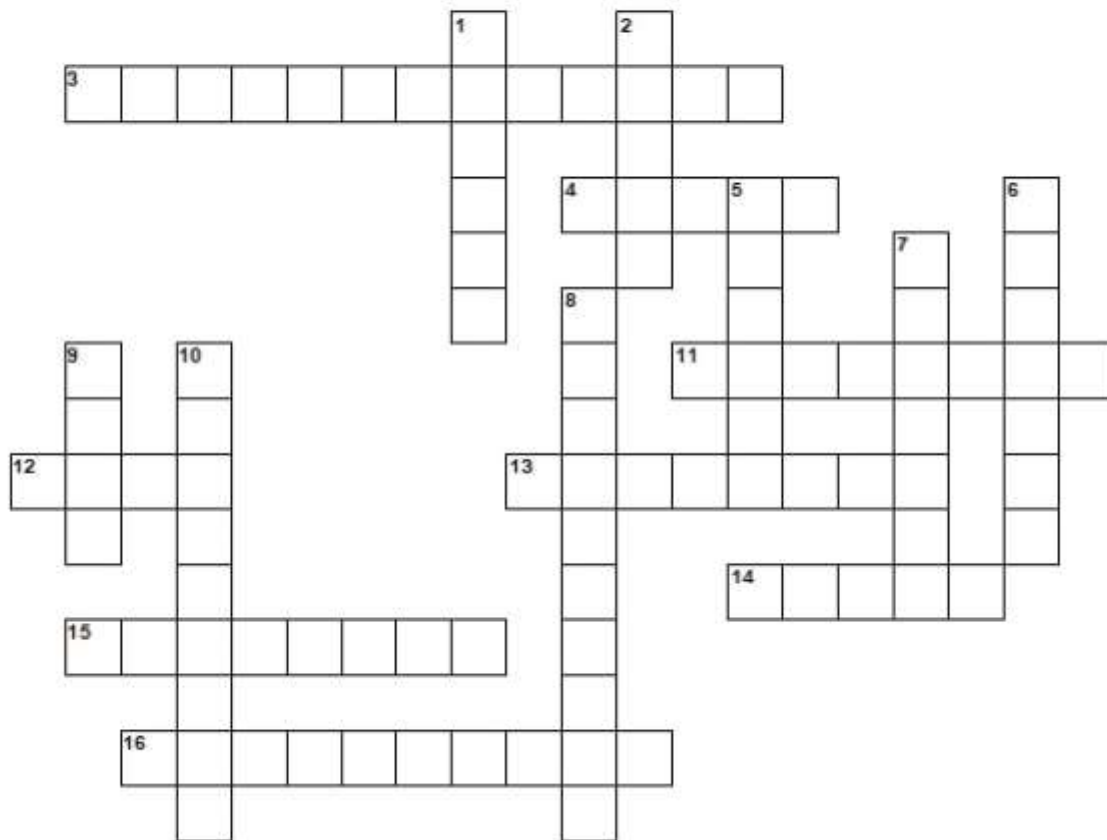
