

#### **Local Church Budget ~ January 16, 2021**

A church member lost his job when his company downsized. He knew that for weeks he would be without food and without the ability to pay his bills. He told the pastor about his situation.

The church board requested his rent and utility bills. It shocked this man that the church


would give, not loan, the money to help pay the bills.


