It was a pretty location with shade and a place to sit, but it wasn't the end.

The rest of us persevered and finished the hike. We enjoyed the fruit of our labor. We realized our goal. We enjoyed the beautiful vista of a high mountain lake surrounded by craggy cliffs.

Sometimes in life we stop short, we end our journey before the destination is reached.

This week we continue our study of Acts in chapter 19 where we will meet a group of people who had gone part way with God but had stopped short, they didn't finish, they hadn't realized the full implications of the path they were on.

Jeff will be missed by this congregation and the surrounding community. We look forward to a heavenly reunion.


A memorial service will be held Monday, March 22 at 3:00pm here at the Eastgate Seventh-day Adventist Church.
