As a young teenager I had a dream: To work at summer camp! I'd attended as a camper since I was knee-high to a grasshopper and the greatest thing ever, in my opinion, would be to get paid for a summer of camp life.

The challenge was I wasn't the only teenager wanting to work there. Every year hundreds of high school and college kids applied for these limited positions.

I had "an in," however. I was good friends with a lot of the staff, including some of the leadership at the camp.

In the spring of '96 I was at a youth event where the camp director was leading out. He was looking for a horsemanship instructor because one of the staff members who he'd hired had just backed out. My friends knew this so they laid the groundwork for us to have a conversation and I was hired!

I wasn't hired because I was the most qualified, nor because I was the only option. I was hired because I knew the right person and because I was willing to have the conversation.

This Sabbath we are looking at Acts 19 where Luke describes the spiritual battle in very real terms. As he does this Luke shows us that it's who you know that makes the difference. I hope you can join in!

As our community has moved into phase 3 we are opened up to 50% capacity, which maxes out at 164. That said, we as a church need to continue caring for each other by wearing masks and respecting each other's space. Thanks for your continued sensitivity!

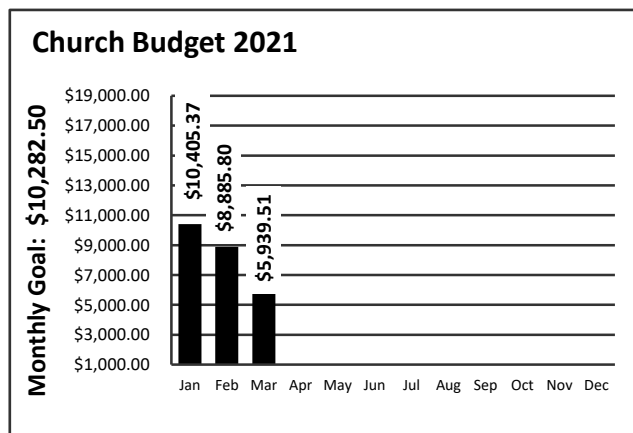

Bob Buford, in his book *Half Time*, notes that Saint Augustine apparently stated "asking yourself the question of your own legacy - What do I wish to be remembered for? - is the beginning of adulthood." I've never thought of it like that, but I think he might be on to something. That the path to an intentional life, one that will ultimately bring me lasting joy, is one that is lived with the end goal in mind rather than just living for the moment.

And Buford gets more personal, sharing how he wants to be remembered, what epitaph he

wants inscribed on his tombstone. The epitaph? Simply “100X.” Taken from the parable of the sower in Matthew 13, he explained “I want to be remembered as the seed that was planted in good soil and multiplied a hundred fold. It is how I wish to live.”

I’m challenged by Augustine and Buford, men who live rich today by looking at the future. I want to hear the words “Well done,” applied to all areas of my life, including how I handled the time, talents, and possessions God has entrusted to me. I especially like the idea of being a productive seed in good soil, bringing forth a good harvest.

Today’s opportunity to plant for an abundant harvest is UCC Advance, which specifically invests in our young people, evangelistic outreach, and building, purchasing, and remodeling facilities for more effective ministry in your community. And that, it seems, is good soil for an abundant harvest.
