Welcome to Eastgate SDA Church! A message from Chaplain Luke Self

During his lifetime, Vincent Van Gogh was considered a failure. After the first woman to whom he professed his love rejected him, he decided to enter the University of Amsterdam to study to become a pastor. After failing the theology entrance exam, he enrolled in a three-month course at a less-rigorous Protestant missionary school. After failing that course, he decided to take up a post as a missionary in Belgium. However, church leaders there dismissed him, saying he was "undermining the dignity of the priesthood."

Discouraged, he returned home to live with his parents who became so frustrated with him that his father threatened to admit him to the "lunatic asylum." About a year later, he shocked his family by professing his love to his recently-widowed cousin, who vehemently rejected him with the words, "No, nay, never!"

Later in life, he enrolled in classes at the Academy of Fine Arts in Antwerp, but feeling misunderstood by his teachers he dropped out. Although he was a prolific painter, producing around 860 oil paintings in his last decade of life, he only sold one in his lifetime.

Failure can be suffocating, especially when we feel like it defines who we are. It seems that this was the case for Van Gogh, as he ended up taking his own life at the age of 37. And yet, Van Gogh is not remembered today as a failure, but rather as a genius whose paintings today sell for tens of millions of dollars and whose style broadly influenced the art world.

As tragic as Van Gogh's story is, it teaches us that our failures should not define who we are. We are so much more than even all of our failures combined.



Jesus saw the widow bring her offering to the temple. She gave two of the smallest coins in the temple monetary system. She waited until she thought no one was watching, for her gift was so small. Yet, Jesus commended her. "Of a truth I say unto you, that this poor widow hath cast in more than they all." Luke 21:3 How can that be?

The rich gave large coins. But the widow gave her heart as part of her offering.

A Christian writer commented on this passage. "A heart of love and genuine faith in a worthy object is more acceptable to God than the

most costly gift. The poor widow gave her living to do the little that she did.... It was this unselfish spirit and unwavering faith that won the commendation of Jesus." {3SP p. 72}

We may think the size of our offering makes it valuable to God. But no, the size of the heart gives value to the gift. God will take the offering we give with our hearts and magnify our offering into something special for His service.

Does this mean we should not sacrifice as we give? Here are the words of Jesus. "For all these have of their abundance cast in unto the offerings of God: but she of her penury [extreme poverty;

destitution] hath cast in all the living that she had." (Luke 21:4). The widow sacrificed with her heart. As a result, God blessed her gift.
