Herd dynamics are an interesting thing. My first year working as a horsemanship instructor at youth camp I learned a lot about how horse herds work.

Each spring as the camp season approached we would gather the horses from their winter homes across the northwest and install them in their summer abode at the youth camp.

Because the horses hadn't seen each other for nine months there was always a lot of horsey conversations and sizing up of each other.

This process took the form of squealing, posturing, bluffing aggression, and if necessary, nips and kicks.

What they were trying to do was establish a pecking order, a society that had clear leaders and followers, dominants and subdominants.

Within a few hours it would become clear who was in charge and who was not.

In many ways this process reflected the world around us. There was little to no concern for the weak, bottom rung horses. Those at the top relished in the choice hay piles.

This world is similar. It's a first-come, first-served, domineering, power-motivated leadership.

Jesus cast a vision for a different kind of society. A different kind of leadership.

This week we continue our series on "Healthy Church" as we explore "Empowering Leadership" as a core characteristic for the community that God wants us to exhibit.



Two Services to return to Eastgate SDA Church ~ Moved to August 6, 2022

At the April church board a discussion focused on our increased church attendance and the possible need for implementing a second church service. A statement was issued that we would start this the first weekend of June. However, after further review and in-put from ministry leaders, a small steering committee for the addition of a second service at Eastgate church has decided to postpone the start date to the first Sabbath in August – August 6. This seems to make sense in several ways:

- It will give us more time to prepare all the details that this change requires.
- It will accommodated the likely dip in summer attendance.
- It will still allow for a few weeks of double services before attendance increases when school resumes at the end of August. This change of date will allow some very specific time of preparation.

Preliminary discussion has suggested a format of Early Service – Sabbath School – Second Service. This will require more staff on the part of Deacons and Deaconesses. Additional Greeters will be needed so individuals are not on their feet throughout the full morning. Details remain to yet be worked out, so if you would be interested in joining a team to help support this transition, please speak with the team leaders for Greeters, Deacons, Deaconesses, A/V, an Elder or the Pastor.



Editorial ~ What does Church Mean to You?

As Adventist pastors meet for the CALLED convention this week in Lexington, Kentucky, I hope they're giving abundant attention to the current state of the church. No, I'm not talking about the management layers of the denomination; I'm talking about the local congregation.

COVID has had more of an effect on us that I think we realize. We've gone through seasons of no attendance, to being connected by Zoom (or other meeting software), streaming our home worship service, or the service of another church.

Now we're coming back to the church building, cautiously, while paying close attention to the waves of COVID strains that sneak up and bite us when we least expect them.

But what I hope the pastors are talking about this week is our expectations of attendance. If we think that members and visitors need to gather in the sanctuary regularly to "bring us back to normal," I think we're setting ourselves up for deep disappointment.

I think we need to start counting *everything* that is happening in the name of our local congregations.

Pastors, count not only the attendance in the sanctuary, but every small group (Sabbath morning and every day of the week), every service group, every outdoor outing and especially those the young adults plan, every online streaming location (and ask them how many people are watching together at each place), and how many are watching the video of the Sabbath services within the week following it. And add whatever else you want.

You get the idea; cast a wide net. Count ALL of it as your church attendance.

And then here's the BIG pill to swallow. Embrace contentment and gratitude for any/all of the ways people choose to participate in these unusual times.
