
## August 20, 2022 **Local Church Budget**

**Appeal:** Exodus 29:1

"This is what you are to do to consecrate them, so they may serve me as priests: Take a young bull and two rams without defect."

#### Offerings Speak Loudly! We

worship God with our offerings because they are sermons without words. After building the tabernacle from the freewill offerings of the people, it was now time to set apart Aaron and his sons for the holy



ministry. Exodus 29 provides details about the ordination service of the first priests in Israel. Interestingly, Moses, the leader, did not deliver a special speech or preach a sermon for this occasion. But one thing was prominent, offerings of various kinds: Sin offering, burnt offering, and wave offering. What were the messages conveyed by these offerings? The sin offering was for the atonement of sin. The priests were reminded that they needed God's grace and forgiveness to qualify for their duty. The burnt offering was burned completely on the altar. It pointed to the total commitment that was required from those called to service. Finally, wave offering was presented in a waving-type motion, elevated and swung to and fro toward heaven. It symbolizes the priest's dedication to God's service and about God's provision for those who sacrificed themselves in service to Him. Through these multiple offerings, they learned the true meaning of their ordination. Do we have some doubts about the pertinence of worshiping God with our offerings? If a local church already has enough financial resources to support its ministries, should it maintain offerings as an element of the worship service? Offerings have a value far beyond monetary. Offerings are sermons without words. They represent acts of worship and convey essential spiritual lessons. Among other things, they remind us of God's gift of salvation, His daily blessings, and our adequate response of total commitment. It would be unwise to silence God's voice by renouncing from practicing offerings. This week as we worship with our tithe and regular offerings let us be attentive to God's voice.

**Prayer:** Lord, we praise You for the multiple ways You talk to us, Your children. As we bring our offerings and tithe today, teach us the spiritual lessons we need.

**Proposal #2** Replace the North Windows of the Sanctuary with standard Low-e glass panels. In addition to the new glass panels, special sunlight reducing window screens would be mounted on the exterior. This would help to control stage lighting for our Live-Streaming Ministry. **Proposal #2 ~ passed** 

**Proposal #3** Following the replacement of the windows some sheetrock repairs would be completed on the walls of the sanctuary. Then to refresh the wall and to cover the repairs and water stains from past water leaks, a fresh coat of paint would be applied to the walls of the sanctuary. **Proposal #3 ~ passed** 

**Proposal #4** To make better use of the space in the sanctuary which was originally designed as a Choral area, the vision of placing a wall which would enclose approximately 60% of the area and create a closet where the extra music stands, microphone stands, additional A/V cables etc. could be stored. This would improve the look of the front of the church and reduce the visual distractions.

# Camp Wooten All Church Retreat ~ September 16 – 18

#### **About the Facilities:**

Camp Wooten is located on the Tucannon River in the Blue Mountains. There is a softball field, paved court for tennis and basketball, hiking available on forested and mountain trails, canoeing on Donnie Lake (canoes provided, flotation devices welcome – this is really more of a pond than a lake). Horse shoe pits are available, bring your own horse shoes. We are working on providing archery also!

#### **Accommodations:**

There is a 1930's era dining hall with fully equipped modern kitchen, 17 cabins that each sleep 11; cedar meeting hall with fireplace; several outdoor shelters; and restrooms and showers nearby. For those wanting to bring their RV's or trailers, there are only 3 maybe four sites with partial hook-ups of water, sewer and electricity.

#### **Cost:**

The rate for the weekend is: \$10.00 per person per night = \$20 for a single person for the weekend. For a couple it would be \$40 for the weekend. For a Family of four or more = \$80 for the weekend. (Mom & Dad with kids = one family unit.) Grandpa & Grandma = a couple, \$40. For those coming out just for the day the rate is \$5.00 per person. We do get charged for everyone who comes into the park. Payments are to be made to the church with a note indicating for Camp Wooten Weekend. Payment prior to the weekend would be appreciated. We would like everyone to be able to go, if this price is a financial hardship, contact Carol Hargreaves or the Pastor for special arrangements.

**Food:** There will some sign-up sheets in the lobby with specific items requested for specific meals.

**Friday Supper:** Baked Potato Bar. Please bring toppings to enhance a baked potato!

**Sabbath Breakfast:** There will be a special treat presented by Carol Hargreaves. However, families should plan to bring their favorite milk or milk substitute, cereal or other main menu items.

**Sabbath Lunch:** We will be having "Haystacks". Beans will be provided. We will ask you all to sign up for and bring other items to compliment this meal.

**Sabbath Supper:** We will fire up a large outdoor grill. You are invited to bring your family favorites "meats" for hotdogs or veggie burgers/grillers etc. The church will provide bread for hot dogs or burgers. Sign-ups will include condiments.

**Sunday Breakfast:** Breakfast will be prepared by the men of the church.


