Arrival Time: Please do NOT arrive prior to 1:00pm on Friday.

Cabins: Please remember that these cabins have been signed up for use by families and friends.

Please respect others' property and space. If you need a place to stay, please see the leadership team.

Tents: There are two specific locations where tents are welcome to be pitched. The lawn near the baseball field is <u>not</u> one of these locations. Please confirm tent site locations before you pitch your tent ~ Thank you!

Refrigeration: There is a glass front refrigerator in which campers may place their personal food items in. The large commercial refrigerators will be used for the communal foods.

Please bring the communal food in upon your arrival and check in with the leadership team.


Elder Jamieson will be speaking at our retreat weekend with a core theme of "It's All About Jesus".

Appeal: Romans 5:8 "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

The Blind Giver Attitude: We worship with our resources because we follow the example of our God, who is a Blind Giver. When God gives, He rarely focuses on the nature of the recipients or even the outcome. He gives out of love. Faithful to this attribute, "He causes his



sun to rise on the evil and the good and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous" (Matt. 5:45). In contrast, we are inclined to give exclusively to what we see and whose outcome we can control. As a result, some have withdrawn from participation in tithe and regular offering, not seeing the direct effect of their contributions. Others have resolved to support only local projects rather than a worldwide mission, far from their eyes. This is not the "blind giver" attitude. We have a glimpse of what can happen when God's people reproduce the "blind giver" attitude. Have you heard about "The Amazon of Hope," a floating church? It is not known by most of us, and even fewer have visited this boat church. However, this project has materialized through the "blind giving" mindset. In 2016, God's children from all over the world pulled funds together to support the 13th Sabbath projects, and one implemented project was the floating church, "The Amazon of Hope," in Brazil. The result is inspiring. In the first 12 full months of operation of the boat church, two hundred and eighty-six people were baptized, and planted three churches in 2017. And this is the testimony of Pastor Reno, who served on the Amazon of Hope: "The boat church is God's way of saving people who have been forgotten by political, economic, and health systems." God, our Example, is involved in a global mission towards those that we see and cannot see, towards those that we know and do not know. This week, as we worship with our tithe and regular offerings we have another opportunity to demonstrate the same global mindset as our God.

Prayer: Lord, we are inspired by Your universal and blindfolded generosity towards humanity. Please help us be givers in Your likeness.



Up-date on our Sanctuary Project

After dealing with a glass company out of Tri-Cities and their sales person, we were disappointed when he, the salesperson, left the company. We have tried multiple times to connect with the company and continue the process of replacing the windows in the sanctuary. We have been unable to get appropriate responses from that company.

We have now initiated contact with another vendor and will soon have a bid from that company. The likelihood of product availability within the next 30 - 60 days is near 0%. Sadly, that work may well get postponed until next spring.

We will move forward with the installation of the new wall which create a storage area behind the Organ as soon as the contractor is available. At the same time we will be addressing matching the wall texture and repair of a spot on the South wall. As these steps are completed we will begin the process of repainting the walls of the sanctuary starting from the back and moving forward on both sides as we go.

We have completed the repainting of a couple of rooms as we strive to keep our meeting spaces in good condition. We will continue to move from space to space as time and money allow. One room we are still working on is the women's restroom. The hole in the ceiling has been closed and preparation for taping and texturing is under way. Repainting will occur when this texturing step is completed.
