So that evening he and I donned our winter jackets, located water valves, and isolated the unseen, underground leak!

The evidence led us to the proper conclusion: we have an unseen water line that needs to be fixed (you'll see the repair in process soon!)

Scripture speaks of "evidence of the unseen" as well. This evidence is Faith.

This Sabbath we're continuing our study in the book of Hebrews as we dive into the first two verses of its most famous portion: chapter 11. Please join us, whether in person or online, as we explore another installment in our series on the Letter to the Hebrews entitled "Evidence of the Unseen."




